

Summary of City of Los Altos Public Lands

The following table provides a brief synopsis of the City land and the key considerations used in determining which sites are best suited for moving to joint consideration by the City of Los Altos and the Los Altos School District. This is not intended to represent an exhaustive analysis, but instead to reflect some key drivers in putting forth what might yield the most productive discussion.

Grant Park	4.50 acres	Not within LASD boundaries
Montclair Park	1.10 acres	Not within LASD boundaries; too small
Heritage Oaks Park	5.33 acres	Too small
Lincoln Park	4.44 acres	Too small
Marymeade Park	2.47 acres	Too small
Redwood Grove	6.12 acres	Limited accessibility
Shoup Park	3.95 acres	Too small
McKenzie Park	4.30 acres	Too small
McKenzie Park/MSC ⁱⁱ	6.80 acres	In combination affords opportunities; potential for single use with possible joint use of outdoor facilities
Rosita Park	5.00 acres	In combination with Covington affords opportunities; potential for single use with possible joint use of outdoor facilities; a combined Covington/Rosita site is approximately 21.7 acres
Hillview Community Center & Park	6.63 acres	Integrated part of a shared 18-acre site with proximity to downtown; multiple entities share site ⁱⁱⁱ ; all uses are year-round; community center operates 7am to 10pm; complexity of adding additional concurrent use

ⁱⁱ Relocation of the Maintenance Service Center (MSC) would be required; alternative sites need to be considered.

ⁱⁱⁱ The 18-acre Civic Center site is home to: City Hall, Police station (including arrest processing and holding facility, central dispatch, emergency communications tower), Los Altos Library (part of the Santa Clara County Library District), Hillview Community Center (including Senior Center), Los Altos Youth Center, Los Altos History Museum, local historic landmarks (J. Gilbert Smith House, Neutra House, heritage apricot orchard), Bus Barn Theatre (including Los Altos Stage Company and Los Altos Youth Theatre), athletic fields (soccer, Little League baseball, bocce ball), and Whistlestop and tot lot playgrounds.
