

## Tree Removal List

In preparation of the storm season, the City's Maintenance Division is removing dead trees and diseased trees that are at high risk of falling in the public right-of-way. Crews are not currently replanting trees after removal due to the drought condition. However, the City is tracking all removed trees and will resume tree planting when the drought restrictions are lifted.

Below is a list of trees that will be removed as part of the current storm preparation efforts:

### **A. Foothill Expressway**

- One liquid amber tree in the median between El Monte Ave. and San Antonio Rd.
- One liquid amber tree in the median between Loyola Dr. and Grant Rd.
- Two liquid amber trees on the shoulder at Peninsular Ave.
- Two liquid amber trees between Grant Rd. and Arboretum Dr.
- One redwood tree approximately 100 feet from the Monument Tree
- One Monterey Pine tree on the shoulder at Vineyard Dr.
- Four purple leaf plum trees in the median between Homestead Rd and Hwy 280

### **B. El Camino Real**

- Three Canary Island Pine trees in the median opposite of Marriott Hotel

### **C. San Antonio Road**

- One Redwood tree on the shoulder at Sevilla Dr.

### **D. McKenzie Park**

- One redwood tree in front of park adjacent to the sculpture

### **E. Fremont Avenue**

- Two pine trees at Kensington Ave and Fremont Ave.
