Alternatives Subcommittee Report

City Council action of January 26, 2016, addressed three recommendations considered by the Alternatives Subcommittee.

- Permits. The number of permits sold in 2016 will be adjusted to 1300, an increase of 300.
- Graduated fines. The enforcement of graduated fines will be implemented, with first and second citations at \$54.50 and subsequent citations at \$151.40.
- License Plate Reader. The use of iParq, a non-LPR parking enforcement technology, will be implemented.

The relevant recommendations by the Alternatives Subcommittee will be dropped and changes to the report and slide presentation made.

In addition, the draft Executive Summary should reflect these changes.

Direct the Los Altos Parking Committee to include alternatives to reduce parking demand and better manage current parking supply in their work plan, including, but not limited to -

- increased price for permits
- use of parking enforcement technology to evaluate and understand parking demand
- encourage full implementation of the Bicycle Transportation Plan
- valet parking
- shuttle parking
- shared parking
- evaluate the impact of any changes
