AGE-FRIENDLY DESIGN



Homeowners, Architects and Contractors:

When building or remodeling a house, the Town of Los Altos Hills and the City of Los Altos encourage including Age-Friendly Design Elements that incorporate universal accessibility features. Age-Friendly Design Elements make houses safer and easier to use for persons who are aging or have certain activity limitation or disabilities. These Age-Friendly Design Elements include but are not limited to:

- An accessible route of travel from the sidewalk or street to the primary entrance with graded surfaces and no steps to the entry if possible. Or depending on the desired design and topography of the site at least one accessible secondary access to the dwelling;
- Thirty-six inch wide doors with low threshold heights;
- Wide halls and an accessible travel routes to the kitchen, bedroom, bathroom and common rooms;
- Adequate work and floor space at appliances;
- Adequate maneuvering space in bathrooms; and
- Minimum or no thresholds in at least one shower with appropriate drainage as required by the Building Department.



LOS ALTOS SENIOR CENTER

September 6, 2012

We propose the following recommendations to make the Los Altos Senior Center more user- friendly and a more cheerful place for our seniors to congregate.

General Modifications

Replace carpeting with possibly carpet tiles so damaged areas could easily be replaced. Consider removing linoleum areas at doors to eliminate surface changes.

Paint all walls soft neutral creamy white on the top portion above the chair rail for brightness and neutral tan on the bottom portion for warmth.

Reorganize all closets and storage cabinets/drawers to maximize space efficiency.

Room Specific Modifications

Room 10

Organize bulletin board in specific sections similar to the information board at entrance.

Place tv screen on wall. Build cabinetry below to house components and incorporate computer station at one end of unit.

Consider moving shuffleboard to another room or eliminate.

Replace existing sofa and chairs with matching or coordinating pieces. Consider two sofas and 2 chairs. Replace coffee table with a laminate top table for durability in either wood or granite pattern.

Add larger puzzle table and possibly a second table.

Build in cabinetry along window wall for coffee and food service so it is all in one place and eliminates crossing the entrance with hot coffee.

Remove existing free standing credenza.

Refinish sink wall cabinetry to match color of existing cabinetry & storage area near entrance for more unified appearance.

Room 11

Build new cabinetry to house tv as well as audio and book library under windows on entrance wall. Build new cabinetry perpendicular for table and chair storage.

Room 12

Build new standard height cabinetry and replace counter top at sink wall similar to Room 11. Consider shortening counter and opening up a new doorway located between tall cabinets and sink counter to connect with Room 11.

Replace cabinetry and counter top at large window wall with large drawer cabinetry for supplies similar to Room 11.

Paint tall cabinetry to freshen.

Build cabinetry under windows at entrance wall to store tables and chairs.

Relocate white boards if necessary to keep.

Below are the ballpark estimates you requested based on our suggestions to refurbish the Senior Center.

Carpet for 3 rooms - \$6000

Tear out, installation, pad - \$3600 plus tax

Paint for 3 rooms including windows & doors - \$7500

Paint for cabinetry for every 6' lineal measurement - \$1500

Furniture for Room 10 – commercial grade, 2 sofas, 2 chairs, 1 cocktail table - \$5100. Option would be to find used commercial furniture @ Better Source warehouse in San Mateo/Menlo Park

Art work or posters – approximately 20" x 30" framed poster - \$200

Interior Design consultation fee to oversee selections and coordination of carpet, cabinetry design, paint, furniture and art, etc. - \$125/hour/person.

Thank you for the opportunity to help in your efforts to refurbish the Senior Center. We hope this has been helpful as a starting point for the project.

The Senior Commission was privileged to have you attend our December 5, 2011 meeting in response to our request for better lighting throughout Los Altos. You explained that the citizens do not want more street lights to maintain the "village" ambience. Also citizens do not want bright lights shining into their homes at night. We reported some issues that could be addressed like street lights that were out and trees that totally obstructed the light from existing street lights. You listened and said these would be looked at and worked into the budget. One of the areas where bulbs needed to be replaced was in front of City Hall.

The bulbs have been replaced but the wattage is very low. Since there are no homes to be annoyed by extra lighting and safety is an issue, would it be possible to replace the present lighting with some that would illuminate the steps and the walkway leading from the building?

We are adding a lot of new condominiums to our downtown areas. We think this is great for all ages. However, the residents of these new homes will, hopefully, be walking downtown to eat, go to the drugstore, or just window shop for another day. First Street has some exceedingly dark areas. Will the contractors be adding some lighting?

We would welcome another visit from you to address these issues.

**Advisory Council Minutes
Santa Clara Senior Center
October 1st, 2012**

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by interim Chairperson Bob Lindley at 12:30 PM. A quorum was present.

Approval of Agenda and Minutes

The minutes and agenda were approved. The June minutes were not available for review and will therefore be approved at the November meeting

Medicare & Healthcare Forum Announcement

Marcelo Espiritu from COASV's Health Insurance Counseling & Advocacy Program came to speak to the group about an upcoming Medicare & Healthcare Forum. The Forum is held October 6th from 9-12, and was put together in conjunction with Assemblymember Jim Beall. The keynote speaker is State Insurance Commissioner Dave Jones.

Program – Ballot Propositions, League of Women Voters

Carol, Jim, and Dick came from the League of Women Voters to discuss local ballot propositions on the November 6th ballot. The League was organized in 1920, and began allowing men to join as members in 1970. You can find more information on the league and on the below summarized propositions at lwvc.org, lwvsjsc.org, or smartvoter.org.

Prop 30 – Measure to raise taxes to balance budget, otherwise trigger cuts will occur to education. Income and sales taxes will increase.

Prop 38 – An alternative measure to 30 which will also raise certain taxes, but with special funding dedicated to education. 60% of funds will go to K-12, 30% to the state debt for a limited time, and 10% to early childhood education.

Prop 31 – Prohibits the legislature from spending +\$25M without identifying an offsetting revenue source. Also establishes a 2 year budget cycle (as opposed to 1), and allows the governor to cut the budget unilaterally during a fiscal emergency if the legislature doesn't act.

Prop 32 – Prohibits political contributions from payroll deductions of a company/union. This will primarily affect unions.

Prop 40 – A YES vote affirms the existing redistricting approved by the voters recently. NO supporters have withdrawn their opposition.

Prop 39 – Changes how taxes are collected on multi-state businesses in California, ideally leveling the playing field between multi-state business and California-only businesses. Funds would go to energy efficiency, clean energy jobs, and schools.

The following are local ballot measures:

Measure A – Raise 1/8% sales tax for Santa Clara County, with funding going for a variety of purposes.

Measure B – Renews parcel tax until 2028 to support the Water District.

Measure D – Raises minimum wage from \$8 to \$10 with CPI increases in the City of San Jose, with exceptions.

Measure E – San Jose’s current two card rooms have 98 tables. This measure would add 30 tables this year and 30 tables next year total. Also increases tax on the card rooms from 13% to 15%, and any type of gaming legal in card rooms throughout California would be legal in San Jose’s card rooms.

Speeches & Election of Officers 11/12

Connie & Denny, two members who planned on serving as Chair and Secretary, are unable to do so and therefore nominations were accepted from the floor for those positions. Wes Mukoyama accepted the nomination for Chair, Rosemary Bacy accepted the nomination for Secretary, and Gabrielle Tiemann agreed to accept the nomination for Vice-Chair. The slate was nominated unanimously by the body and will begin their term at the next meeting.

Aging Services Collaborative

Jennifer Burkett and Susan Fent of the Aging Services Collaborative came to update the group on the ASC and their policy agenda. There are 4 core members of the ASC – COASV, the Health Trust, Catholic Charities, and the SCC Department of Aging & Adult Services. The ASC is dedicated to improving the lives of local seniors. The policy agenda sets priority areas for ASC focus and advocacy. The current priorities are: 1. Public funding, 2. Transportation services, and 3. Long-Term support services. The next advocacy meeting for the group is October 9th at the Health Trust, which Advisory members are encouraged to attend. The next All ASC meeting is October 10th at the Sobrato Center, from 2-4 pm. You can find out more and sign up for ASC alerts at www.agingservicescollaborative.org.

CSL

Denny has also resigned from his seat as CSL Senior Assemblymember. The Advisory Council will appoint a replacement. If you are interested in seeking this appointment, let Mike know. If there is more than one valid candidate, we will hold an election at the November 5th meeting.

New Business

Boo mentioned that she is interested in hearing Sue Taylor’s presentation on medical cannabis for seniors as an upcoming program. Sue will be scheduled at an upcoming meeting as space permits.

Old Business

Mike distributed sign-up sheets for various member duties.

Boo motioned to send a letter to Council on Aging’s Board of Directors requesting they hire an individual as a housing advocate for seniors, as discussed at the previous meeting. The motion was approved by the membership. Boo will draft the letter.

Chair’s Report

Bob discussed CARA’s legislative positions.

Announcements

- Nancy distributed their legislative report card on key bills for California Seniors

- Renita noted that soon you will need to dial 1-408 for all local numbers due to the addition of the 669 area code
- Skip discussed his upcoming seminars
